DIVISION I HORTICULTURE

All specimen classes are OPEN; you may enter TWO ITEMS but they must be different cultivars.
Exception to this rule will be specified where applicable.

Section 'A' Flower Specimens

1. Aster, annual 1 cultivar3 blooms
2. Begonia, tuberous, **with foliage**, floating in water 1 bloom
Floating means not touching the sides or bottom of the container. Bring bloom and container separately & put together at the show.
3. Begonia, other types1 stem
4. Celosia..... 1 plume
5. Coleus..... 1 stem
6. Cosmos maximum 45 cm (18") 1 stem
7. Dahlia, any colour/typeunlimited entries
8. Daylily (Hemerocallis), no foliage..... 1 bloom
9. Echinacea, any colour 1 bloom
10. Foliage, from any plant (NIP) 1 stem/leaf
11. Gaillardia (Blanket Flower) 1 stem
12. Geranium (Pelargonium) 1 stem
13. Gladiolus 1 stem
14. Grasses, Ornamental, 1 cultivar (NIP).....3 stems
15. Impatiens 1 stem
16. Japanese Anemone 1 stem
17. Marigold, single, 1 cultivar3 stems
18. Marigold, double, 1 cultivar.....3 stems
19. Phlox, white.....1 stem
20. Phlox, any other colour 1 stem
21. Rose, any type..... 1 bloom or spray
22. Rudbeckia3 stems
23. Salvia, 1 cultivar3 stems
24. Sedum1 stem
25. Sunflower, any colour, weighted containers please 1 bloom
26. Any tropical (NIP)(see Definition of Terms) 1 bloom/stem
27. Zinnia, any colour/type..... 1 bloom
28. Any other annual (NIP) 1 bloom or stem
29. Any other perennial/biennial (NIP) 1 bloom or stem

Section 'B' Branches of Trees, Shrubs and Vines

ALL BRANCHES MUST BE UNDER 76 cm / 30"

30. Hibiscus (Rose of Sharon).....1 branch
31. Hydrangea, ball type1 branch
32. Hydrangea, cone type1 branch
33. Hydrangea, lace type1 branch
34. Any other flowering branch (NIP)1 branch
35. Any other foliage branch (NIP).....1 branch

Section 'C' Fruits & Vegetables

36. Beans, 1 cultivar (with calyx & portion of stem attached)5 pods
37. Beets, 1 cultivar (tops trimmed to 2.5 cm/1" above crown, leave root on)....3 roots
38. Cabbage, (large coarse outer leaves may be removed)1 head
39. Carrots, 1 cultivar (topped to 2.5 cm / 1").....3 roots
40. Cucumbers, slicing, 1 cultivar (short stem should remain)2 fruit
41. Cucumbers, pickling, 1 cultivar (short stem should remain)3 fruit
42. Garlic, any type.....2 bulbs
43. Herbs – culinary, 3 types, (must be named)3 stems
44. Lettuce, head type (damaged outer leaves should be removed)1 plant
45. Onions, 1 cultivar.....3 bulbs
Do not peel, only broken outer scales should be removed.
Neatly trim tops and remove roots just below the base.
46. Peppers, 1 cultivar (leave approx. 1.5 cm / 1/2"of stem)2 fruit
47. Potatoes, 1 cultivar, (brush clean).....3 tubers
48. Squash, summer, any type, (stem left attached & trimmed).....1 fruit
49. Tomatoes, over 5 cm / 2", diameter, 1 cultivar (preferable to leave calyx)..3 fruit
50. Tomatoes, 5 cm / 2" & under, diameter, 1 cultivar (preferable to leave calyx)5 fruit
51. Tomatoes any variety1 truss
